What will students learn in the technical training?

Line - A Milk Cows - 36% of Time

- A-1 Operate the milking and milk handling equipment
- A-2 Perform routine maintenance on the milking and milk handling equipment
- A-3 Assess animal health pre-milking and during milking
- **A-4** Prepare cows for milking and perform safe milking procedures
- **A-5** Demonstrate knowledge of milking data recording systems and herd management programs
- A-6 Demonstrate knowledge of cattle behavior and handling livestock of all ages
- A-7 Demonstrate knowledge of milk quality

Line B - Maintain Sanitation, Biosecurity and Control Pests - 7% of Time

- B-1 Perform cleaning and sanitizing routine on milking and milk handling equipment
- B-2 Perform cleaning routine of inside and outside livestock facilities

Line C - Manage Cattle Health - 31% of Time

- C-1 Demonstrate basic knowledge of common dairy cattle diseases and disorders
- C-2 Demonstrate knowledge of good facilities and ventilation
- **C-3** Demonstrate Knowledge of the Proper Management of Dairy Cattle during the Transition Period
- **C-5** Interpret levels, handle and administer basic medications (CQM)
- **C-6** Recognize symptoms of mastitis and administer basic treatment
- C-7 Monitor calving situations and provide assistance where appropriate
- C-8 Demonstrate knowledge of hoof health and care

Line E - Breed Cattle and Detect Estrous Cycle - 8% of Time

E-1 Demonstrate basic knowledge of the estrous cycle in cows

Line G - Work Effectively - 18% of Time

- **G-1** Demonstrate practical use of verbal and written communication
- **G-2** Manage time effectively
- **G-3** Demonstrate safe personal work habits around cattle, farmstead and farm equipment
- **G-4** Demonstrate operation of a variety of farm equipment
- G-5 Demonstrate knowledge, use and care of farm equipment safety devices and features
- **G-6** Demonstrate use of dairy farm record management systems
- **G-7** Demonstrate practical uses of teamwork skills on the farm
- **G-8** Demonstrate understanding of the dairy industry and the nature of dairy work in British Columbia

Apprentices are eligible for a \$1,000 tax credit upon completion of the program.

Employers are eligible for a training tax credit for the first 24 months: 20% of eligible salary and wages up to \$4,000.
